It has been a season of loss and diminution.

May this Easter season be marked with joy and with resurrection hope as we celebrate God's glory and as we witness to God's love in the world.

## Thoughtful Christian Take Home Study: Health Care Reform

Can't the United States work toward health-care reform that is just, affordable, and sustainable? With health-insurance costs rising and the number of uninsured Americans growing, at what level(s) of government does reform need to take place? What should the role of Christians be in advocating change?

This three-session study examines the history of health-care delivery in the U.S. and the current challenges and efforts of health-care reform. It explains how religious values inform health-care reform and explores how we can take faith-based action. Throughout this study, participants are encouraged to educate themselves and participate in efforts to reform health care.

The Take Home Study is available for anyone who wishes to do a self-led Bible Study at their convenience, rather than meeting with a group. This study will be available in the kiosk from Easter Sunday through the end of April. - Plan was outlined for an all-member calling tree to be activated during severe weather conditions, such as power outages.
- Dan Hein is the contact person for transportation service to and from Sunday morning and Wednesday night worship services.
- Carol Brown is sending cookies to our college students.
- Disbursements for ministries since December 16, 2008 included \$190.40 for 2-Coins-A-Meal for December 2008, \$2,458.00 for 2008 Christmas Joy Offering (\$634 increase over 2007 offering), \$117.01 for congregational care, \$375.00 for 1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2009 E.F.P.N., \$250.00 for 1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2009 Midland Area Homes, and \$1,760.30 from Pastor’s Emergency Fund Support.

Highlights of February 2009 meeting:

- A medical (hospital) bed has been donated to the church’s medical supplies lending library.

- Disbursements for ministries since January 25, 2009 included \$700 to Gail McGee for January Haiti health mission trip (total cost was \$1,415) from Member-in-Mission Fund, \$300.00 for Theological Education paid to Presbytery, \$25.00 late-received 2008 Pentecost offering, and most of remaining balance of Pastor’s Emergency Fund Support.

1. Stephen Ministry started in 1975.
2. There are 10,000 congregations enrolled in the Stephen Ministry.
3. There are 150 denominations represented.
4. Stephen Ministry exists in all 50 states, ten Canadian provinces and 24 countries.
5. More than 500,000 people have been trained as Stephen Ministers in their congregations.
6. There are 55,000 pastors and lay persons trained as a Stephen Leader. Those leaders over see and direct Stephen Series Leaders Training Courses and the Stephen Series Training in their congregation.
7. The number of people cared for by a Stephen Minister — more than a million.
8. REMEMBER — You may also be trained as a Stephen Minister starting in September at Trinity Lutheran.

# One Great Hour of Sharing



*One Great Hour of Sharing* began in 1949, in response to the devastation of World War II. Its mission remains remarkably contemporary sixty years later: respond to Christ's love for all people by joyfully sharing that love with people in need. As a result, the refugee and the stranger have found food and safe shelter; those stunned by the aftermath of disasters have found relief and help rebuilding and communities seeking to take control of their future have found partners in development.

Today, projects supported by One Great Hour of Sharing are under way in more than one hundred countries, including the United States and Canada. In recent years Presbyterians have given about \$10 million annually, and the other denominations together have received a similar amount.

Currently the One Great Hour of Sharing committee officially comprises nine Christian denominations including the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

All of the funds raised are used for ministries of disaster relief, refugee assistance, and development aid, and each denomination does a significant portion of those ministries through Church World Service.

After deducting administrative costs (up to 5 percent) and the costs of creating and distributing promotional materials (roughly 5 percent), the remaining undesignated gifts are divided among three programs as follows:

## **Presbyterian Hunger Program** (36 percent)

For ministries working to alleviate hunger and eliminate its causes, responding with compassion and justice to poor and hungry people in local communities, in the nation and throughout the world, as well as ministries addressing homelessness and affordable housing.

## **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance** (32 percent)

For disaster response and ministries with refugees.

## **Self-Development of People** (32 percent)

For partnerships with groups of people who are oppressed by poverty or social systems, who want to take charge of their own lives, have organized to do something about their own condition and have decided what they need to do to produce long-term benefits for themselves.

Surely you have heard about the global food crisis. How is it possible, you might wonder, that more and more of God's children go to bed hungry each night, especially given our globe's vast agricultural and material resources? One Great Hour of Sharing is about sharing our resources, even in these tight and ominous economic times, so that lives may be changed. As churches across the country collect the One Great Hour of Sharing offering, once again we are reminded that where our treasure is, there our heart will be also. Let us give one coin for each meal we ate last week.

God loves us! Let us give one coin for each year we've know that God loves us.

As of the end of February, we were very close to our 2009 budgetary plan for Income. We were, however, up with our expenses at \$53,113. Our expenses were 13% above our plan. This was caused primarily by our heating utilities being up as a result of the unusually cold winter and by the fact that we pay our annual per capita payment to the Lake Huron Presbytery in February each year. It is still early in the year, but we are pleased to be so close to our plan for Income.
